on Major Housing Legislation






Year after year, the League of California Cities delivers major victories protecting local land use authority and providing cities new resources and tools to meet their community's housing needs. Below are highlights of the major housing bills that Cal Cities has won for its member cities in the past few years.

100+ Housing and land use bills protecting and enhancing local control

MAJOR HOUSING LEGISLATION CAL CITIES **DEFEATED** THAT WOULD HAVE ERODED LOCAL LAND USE AUTHORITY

SB 50 (2020)	Would have eroded local control and provided/given new rights to developers	<i>Defeated</i>	WIN 
SB 899 (2020)	Would have allowed developers to override local authority	<i>Defeated</i>	WIN 
AB 1484 (2020)	Would have limited the ability of cities to impose housing development fees	<i>Defeated</i>	WIN 
AB 3145 (2020)	Would have arbitrarily capped housing development fees	<i>Defeated</i>	WIN 
AB 1568 (2019)	Would have linked transportation funding dollars to housing production	<i>Defeated</i>	WIN 
SB 827 (2018)	Would have eroded local land use authority around major transit stops and corridors	<i>Defeated</i>	WIN 
SB 831 (2018)	Would have made major changes to Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) law	<i>Defeated</i>	WIN

AB 434 (2020)	Streamlines seven housing programs into a single grant application to make coordinated awards	<i>Passed</i>	WIN 
SB 2 (2017)	Estimated \$250 million annually to local government housing programs	<i>Passed</i>	WIN 
SB 540 (2017)	Cal Cities-sponsored bill to streamline local planning process and CEQA review	<i>Passed</i>	WIN 
\$300 million to support local homelessness efforts (2020)		<i>Funding secured</i>	WIN 
\$500 million in state CARES act funding available to all cities (2020)		<i>Funding secured</i>	WIN 
\$500 million to support infill development projects and supporting infrastructure (2019)		<i>Funding secured</i>	WIN
