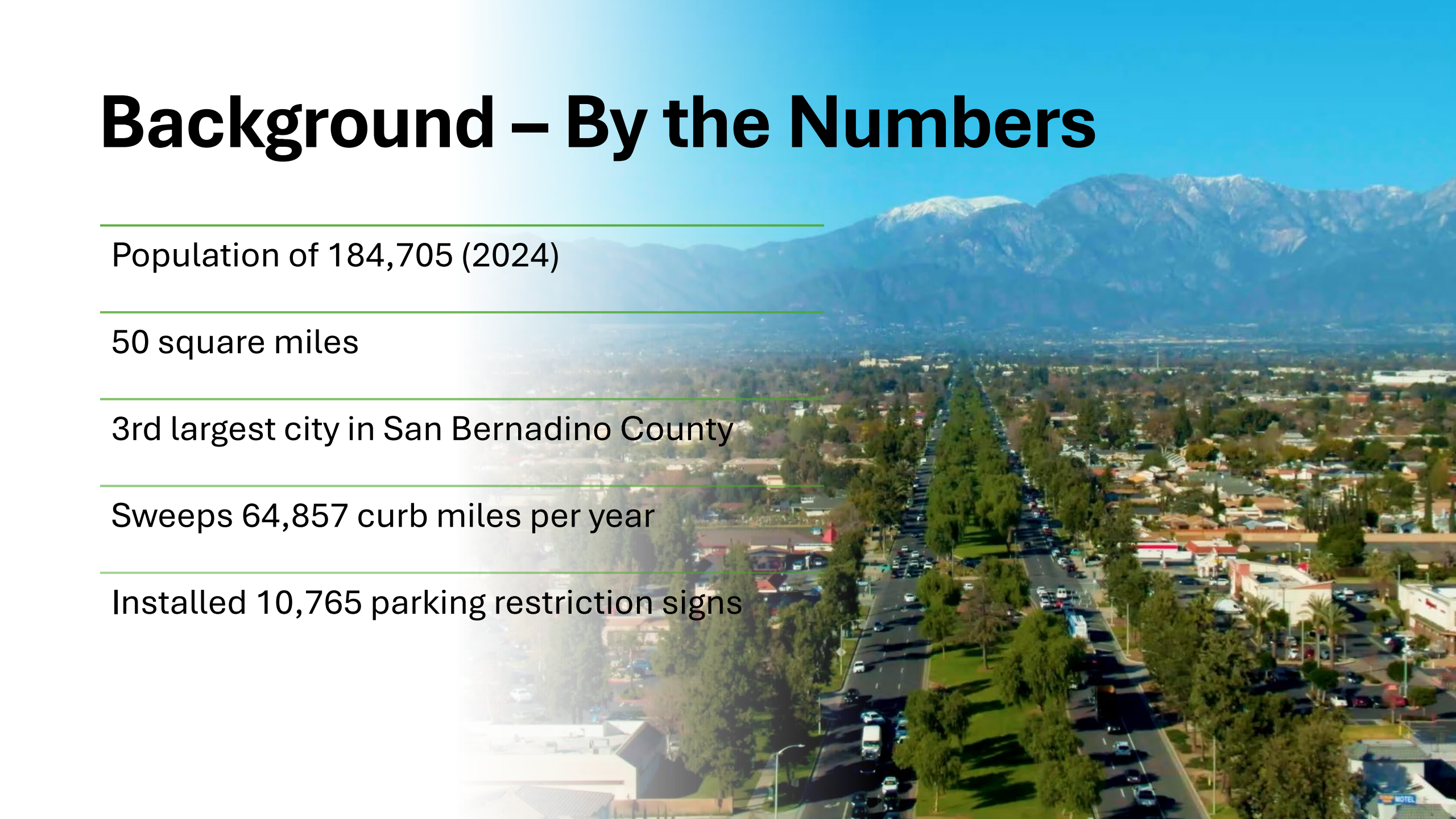

Background – Timeline of Events

On-going complaints regarding lack of cleanliness on City streets due to parked vehicles

July 6, 2021 - City Council adopts Ordinance to adopt standards for parking restrictions on public streets for street sweeping services

December 2023 – April 2024 – Staff engages in Street Sweeping Contract negotiations

April 18, 2024 - Sign Fabrication and Installation RFP closes

June 4, 2024 - City Council approves Maintenance Services Agreement for Citywide Street Sweeping Services effective July 1, 2024

July 16, 2024 - City Council adopts Resolution establishing Citywide parking restrictions, and approves Sign Fabrication and Installation Contract

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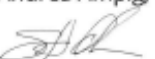

SUBJECT: A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PARKING RESTRICTIONS FOR STREET SWEEPING PURPOSES CITYWIDE AND A MAINTENANCE SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH SUPERIOR PAVEMENT MARKINGS FOR FABRICATION AND INSTALLATION OF CITYWIDE STREET SWEEPING SIGNAGE SERVICES

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council take the following actions:

- Adopt a Resolution establishing parking restrictions Citywide for street sweeping purposes; and
- Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute a one-year Maintenance Services Agreement with Superior Pavement Markings, of Cypress, California, for Fabrication and Installation of Citywide Street Sweeping Signage Services, for a total contract amount not-to-exceed \$1,869,821.

THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL GOALS ARE BEING ACHIEVED:

Invest in the City's Infrastructure (Water, Streets, Sewers, Parks, Storm Drains and Public Facilities)

FISCAL IMPACT: The annual cost of the Maintenance Services Agreement for the Fabrication and Installation of Citywide Street Sweeping Signage with Superior Pavement Markings is \$1,851,308, plus \$18,513 for urgency services for a total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$1,869,821. If approved, additional appropriations in the Integrated Waste Fund will be requested at a future quarterly budget update as needed.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS: On June 4, 2024, the City Council approved a Maintenance Services Agreement with CMAX Commercial Maintenance, Inc. for Citywide Street Sweeping Services. The goal of the street sweeping program is to provide economical services that sustain and restore City streets to maintain a clean and safe environment. Street sweeping is a requirement of the state and federal National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) and the City's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit. Debris collected in the gutter can block stormwater facilities, and cause flooding during heavy rains. Street sweeping removes debris from streets and gutters

and keeps pollutants from entering the City's storm drains.

On July 6, 2021, the City Council adopted Street Sweeping Parking Restrictions (OMC Section 4-6.1019) for residents who wish to establish parking restrictions on their street on street sweeping days in order for sweeping trucks to thoroughly remove debris from the curb and gutter areas on sweeping days. Staff is now proposing to establish citywide parking restrictions to enhance the quality of street sweeping throughout the City. Should the City Council agree to establish citywide parking restrictions, it should adopt the proposed Resolution, in accordance to OMC Section 4-61019 (c).

In April 2024, the City solicited proposals for Fabrication and Installation of Citywide Street Sweeping Signage Services. Four (4) proposals were received that met the bid criteria and standards necessary to perform this work.

Superior Pavement Markings Located in Cypress, California, submitted the lowest responsible proposal with \$1,851,308.00. Based on proposal, credentials, pricing, and favorable reference checks.

The proposed Maintenance Services Agreement includes the fabrication and installation of 10,765 parking restriction signs citywide. The proposed scope of services also includes updating the City's Geographic Information System (GIS) to include the new parking restriction signs. Staff plans to create a public information campaign prior to and through the beginning of the enforcement period. Superior Pavement Markings is anticipated to begin sign installation in September 2024 and complete installation in February 2025.

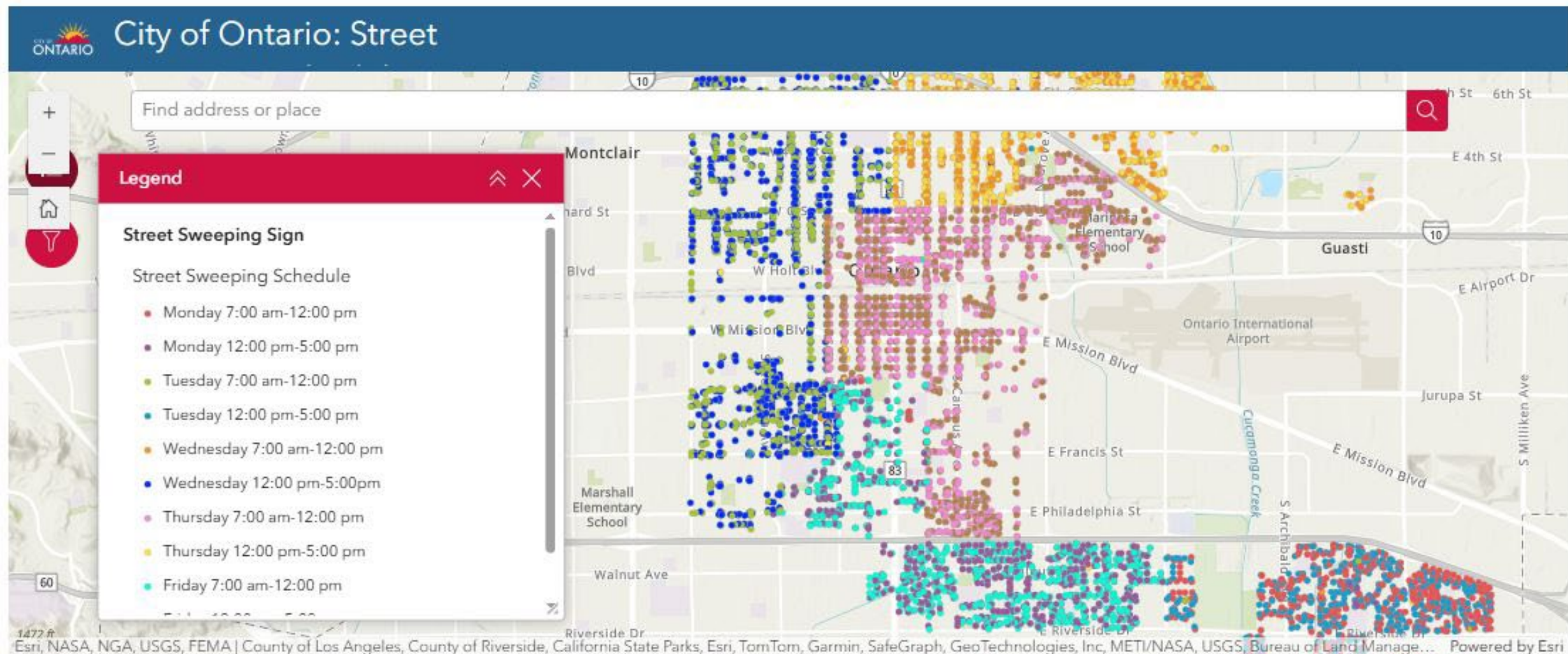

Street Sweeping Schedule Map



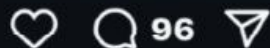

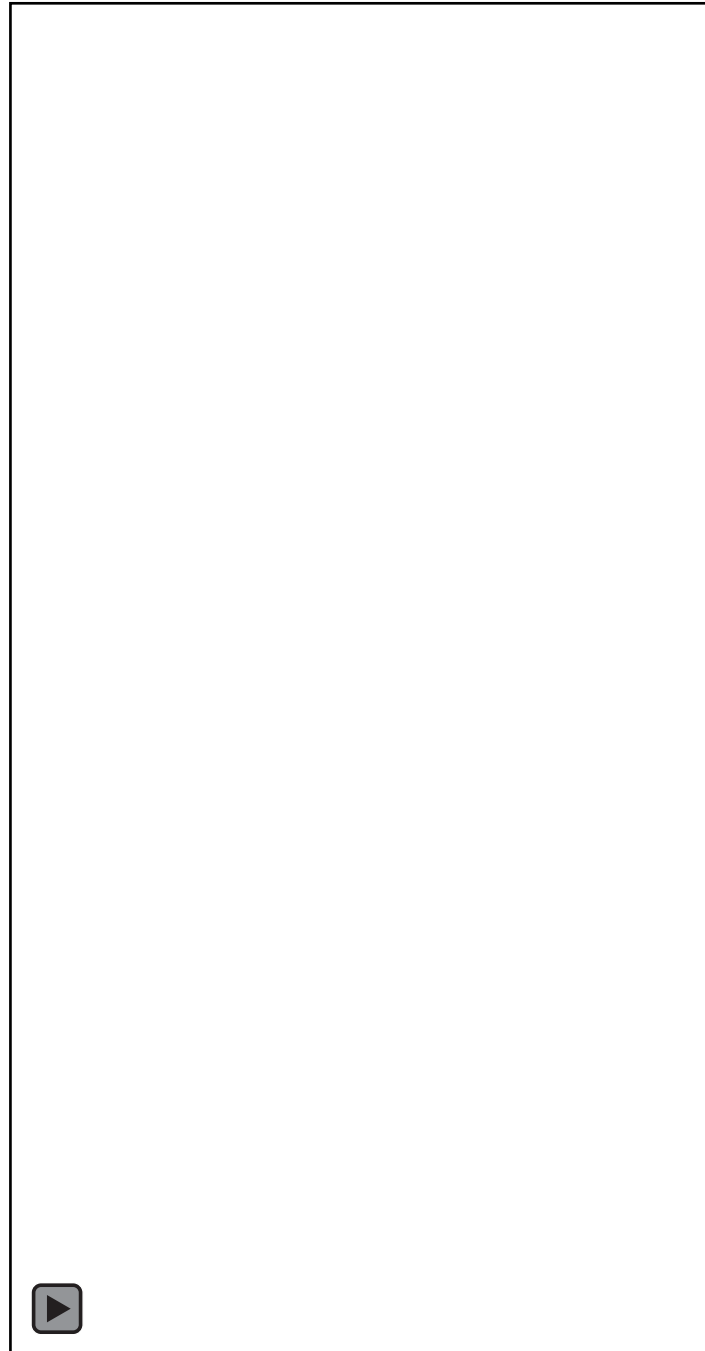

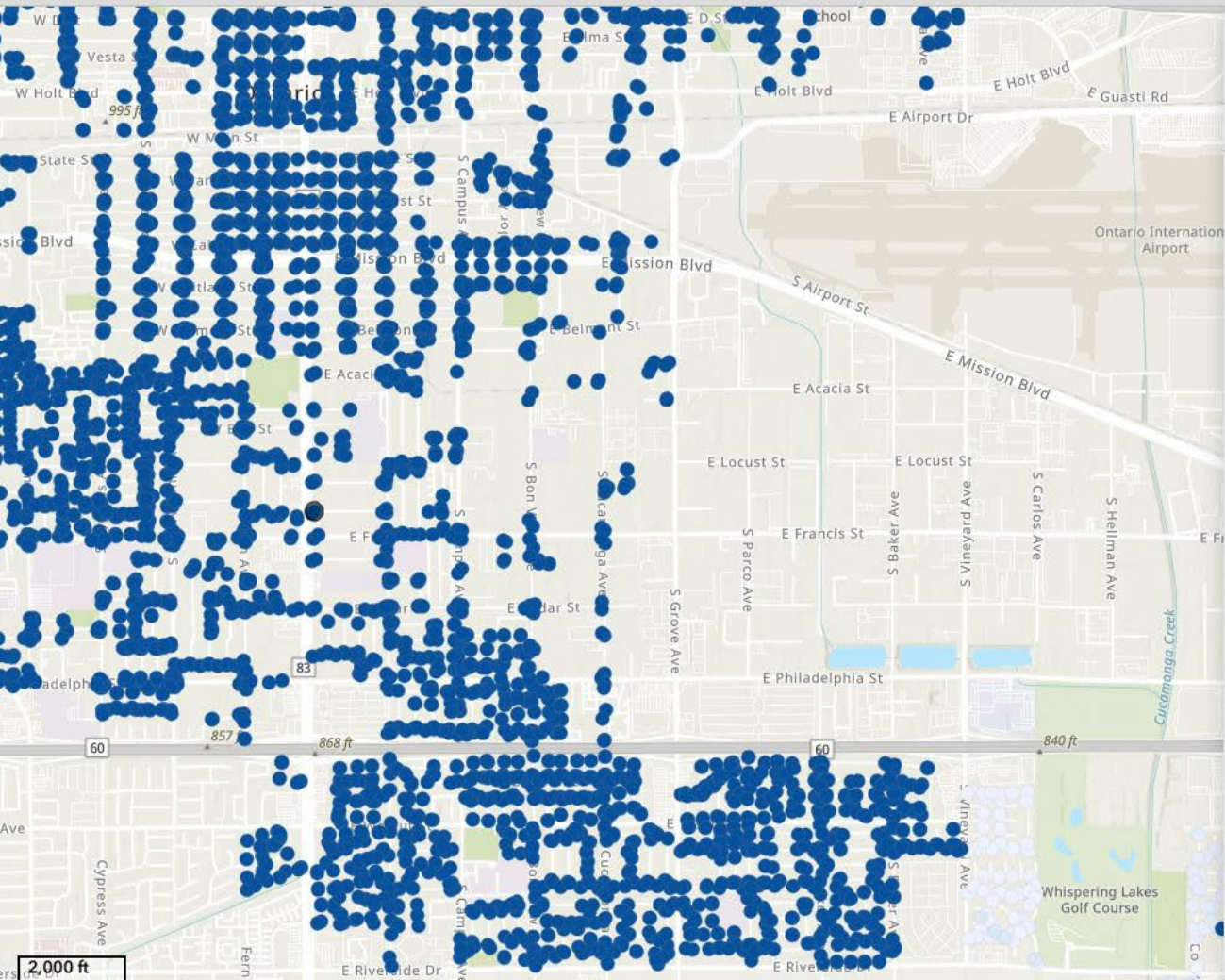

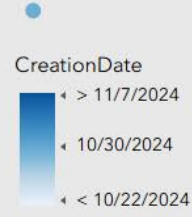

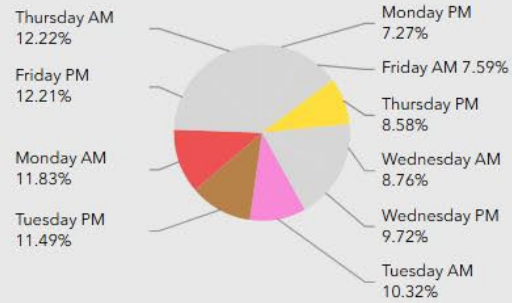


Street Sweeping Sign Points

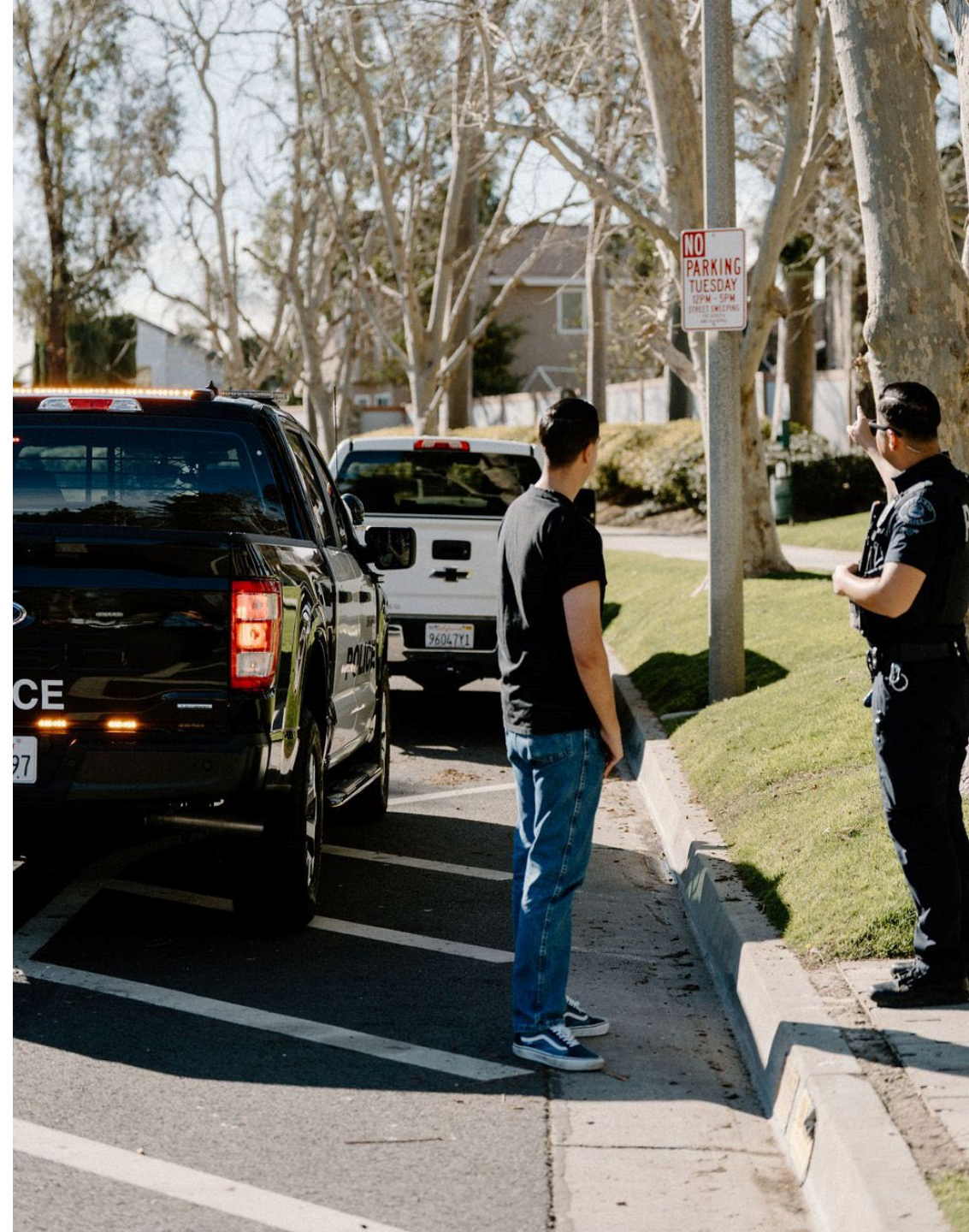
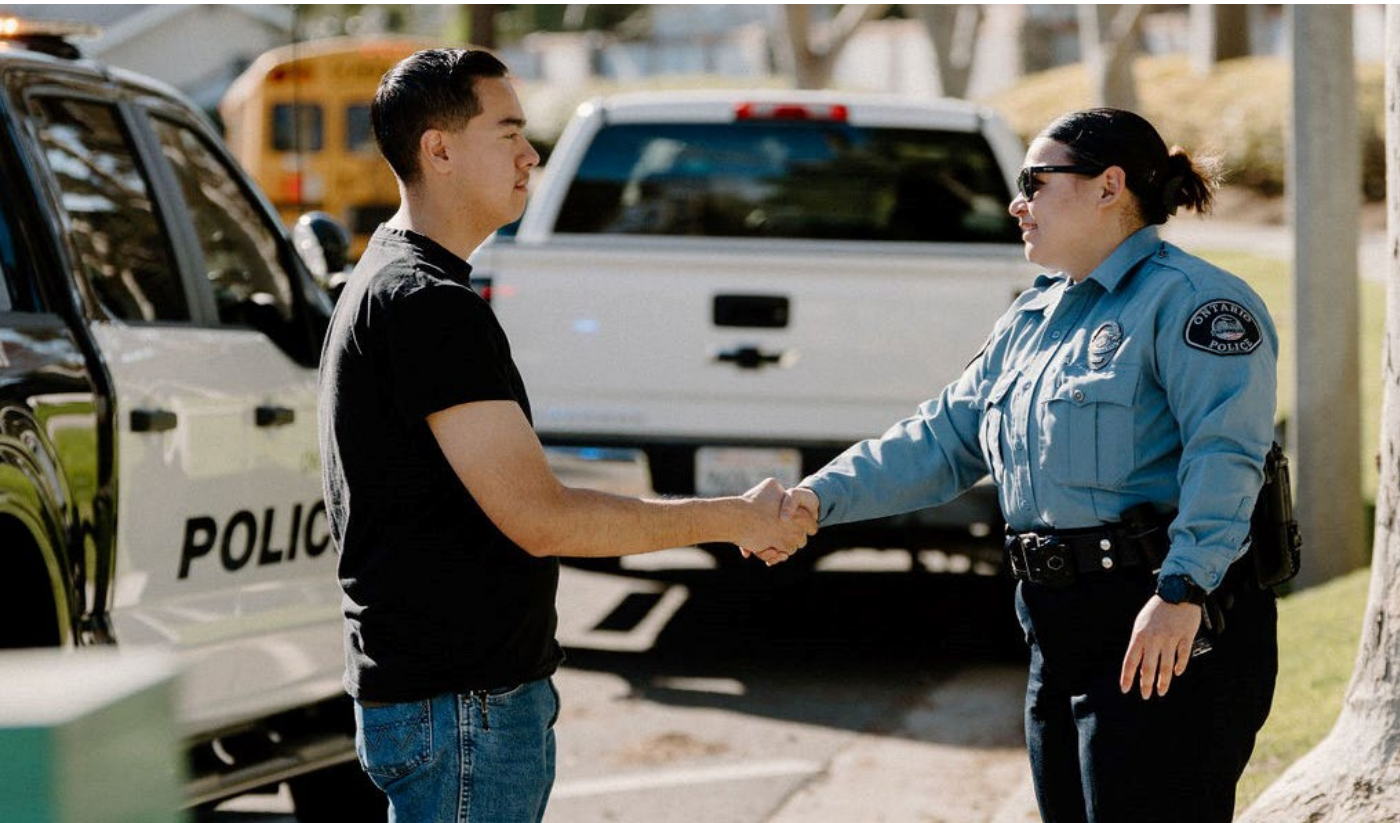

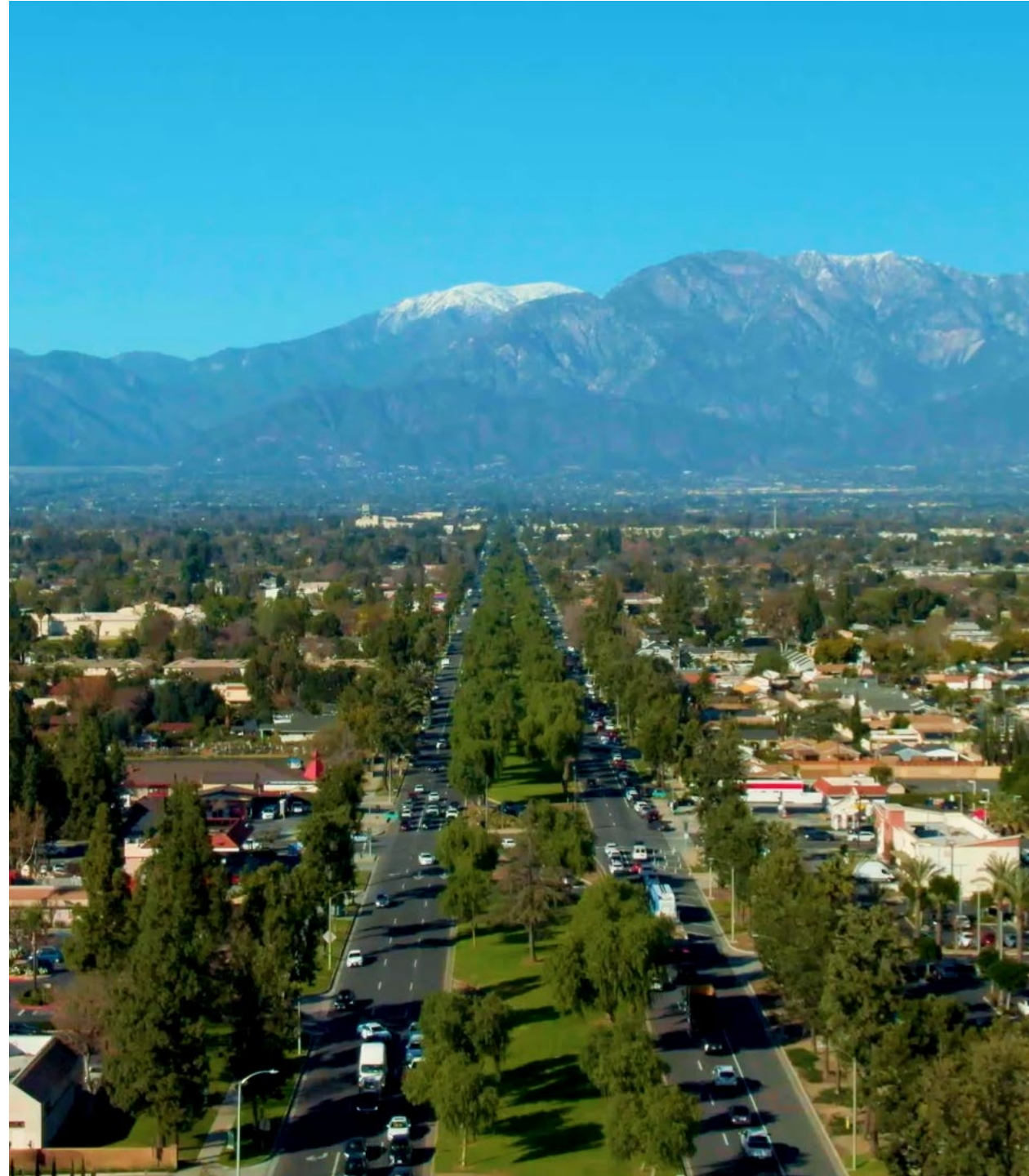

 - Public misconception of immediate enforcement upon sign installation
 - Resident concerns regarding impacted parking in certain areas
 - Schools and HOAs appreciate the communications from the City
